	a person or business that sells goods to the public in relatively small quantities for use or consumption rather than for resale
	an agent who supplies goods to retailers
	a person or organization that provides something needed such as a product or service.
	a person or company that makes goods for sale.
	entire process of making and selling commercial goods, including every stage from the supply of materials and the manufacture of the goods through to their distribution and sale.
	space available for storing something, in particular allocated space in a warehouse
	a large building where raw materials or manufactured goods may be stored prior to their distribution for sale.
	the business or process of packing goods
	the goods kept on the premises of a shop or warehouse and available for sale or distribution
	goods that are carried from one place to another, by ship, aircraft, train, or truck, or the system of transporting these goods

	the official department that administers and collects the duties levied by a government on imported goods.
	the act of sharing or combining two or more manufactured goods in a container or a truck
	a complete list of items such as property, goods in stock, or the contents of a building.
	a person who purchases goods and services for personal use
	goods carried on a ship, aircraft, or motor vehicle
	a large metal box of a standard design and size used for the transport of goods by road, rail, sea, or air.
	the action of loading a ship with cargo
	the transport, storage and delivery of goods coming into a business
	the transport, storage and delivery of goods going out of a business
