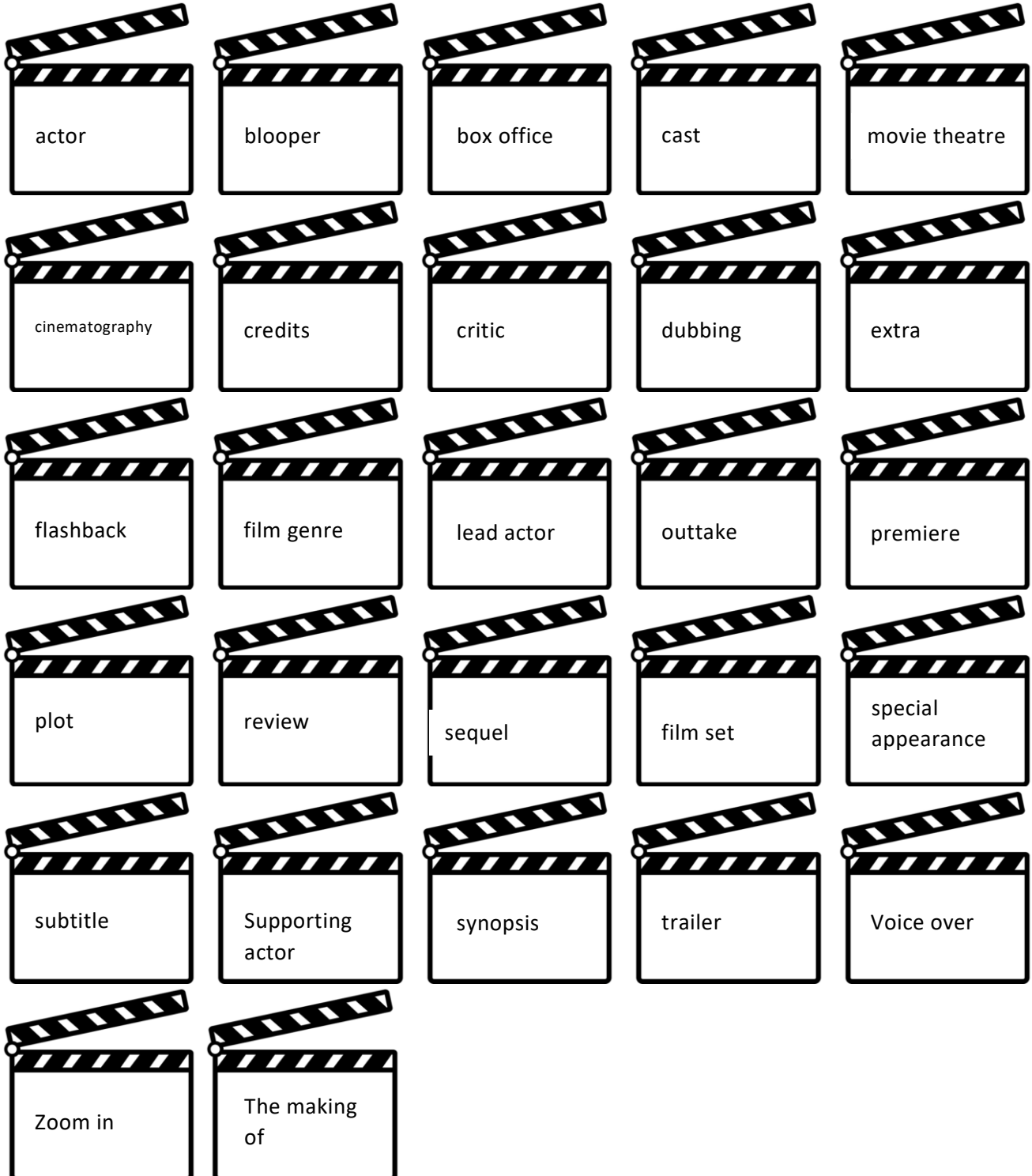

## 46 Movie Terms

- **actor** a performer in theatre, television, or film
- **blooper** an embarrassing mistake
- **box office** the office where tickets of admission are sold
- cameraman a photographer who operates a movie camera
- **cast** all the actors in a film / a person who assigns to roles to the actors
- character a person represented in a film
- choreographer someone who creates new dances
- cinema a medium that disseminates moving pictures
- **cinematography** the art of shooting a film
- **credits** an acknowledgement of the work done (at the end of the film)
- costumer someone who designs or supplies costumes
- **critic** a person engaged in the analysis and interpretation of art
- director the person who directs the making of a film
- **dubbing** the replacement of a soundtrack in one language by one in another language
- editor the person who determines the final content of a text
- **extra** a minor actor in crowd scenes
- film a series of moving pictures that tells a story
- **flashback** a transition in a story to an earlier event or scene
- flash-forward a transition to a later event or scene that interrupts the normal chronological development of the story
- genre a category / classification of films
- **lead actor** a person playing the role of the protagonist (largest role)
- lighting apparatus for supplying artificial light effects for the stage or a film
- movie theatre a theatre where films are shown
- **outtake** a scene that is filmed but is not used in the final editing of the film
- **premiere** the first public performance of a play or movie
- **plot** the general course of a story / story line (with all the events)
- producer someone who finances and supervises the making of a show
- **review** a report in the media in which a person gives his opinion
- scene series of pictures constituting a unit of action in a film
- screenwriter a person that writes the screenplay (the script that the actors speak)
- script something written by hand
- **sequel** a part added to a book or film that continues and extends it
- **set** scenery used to identify a location of a dramatic production
- sound effect an effect that imitates a sound called for in the script of a play
- soundtrack sound recording / music background in a film
- **special appearance** a famous actor who is seen only a couple of minutes in the film
- special effect an effect used to produce scenes that cannot be achieved by normal techniques
- studio workplace consisting of a building where movies are produced and recorded
- stunt man a stand-in for movie stars to perform dangerous stunts
- **subtitle** written translation of foreign dialogue of a movie
- **supporting actor** an actor who performs a role in a play or film below that of the leading actor
- **synopsis** a **brief summary** of the main points of an argument
- **trailer** an advertisement for a film consisting of short parts taken from it

- voice over the voice on an unseen commentator in a film or television program
- writer a person who is able to write and has written something
- zoom in examine closely; focus one's attention on
